

## Criminal Records Check

Students participating in the Computer Information Systems (CIS) and the Criminal Justice Science (CJS) programs seeking a degree in the Cyber Investigation Technologies, will be required to complete a background/criminal records check prior to enrolling in Computer Forensics (CIS 208).

**NOTE: A background check must be completed prior to enrolling in Computer Forensics (CIS 208), and no exceptions will be made.**

The Criminal Justice Department will facilitate the background check by completing both the Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI), and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for all participants. The fee for the background check is \$65.00, and the results will be mailed directly to the Criminal Justice Department.

The background checks will validate that a student enrolled in the program has not been convicted of, has not plead guilty to, and has not had a judicial finding of guilt for violating the following sections of the Ohio Revised Code or a similar law of another state, the United States, or another country within the past year:

Further, a person may be denied entry into Computer Forensics (CIS 208) for the following:

- any felony
- a crime involving gross immorality or moral turpitude
- a misdemeanor committed in the course of practice

The paramount purpose of the background check is to determine the likelihood of employability in sensitive and high security environments.
