

Constitutional Rights Warnings

- 1.** You have the right to remain silent. You do not have to make any statements or answer any questions.
- 2.** Anything you say can and will be used against you in a court of law.
- 3.** You have the right to speak with a lawyer for advice before you are asked any questions. You have the right to have a lawyer with you during questioning.
- 4.** If you cannot afford a lawyer, a lawyer appointed by the Court or a lawyer from the Public Defender's Office will be provided to you before and during questioning without any cost to you.
- 5.** If you decide to answer questions now without a lawyer present, you will still have the right to stop answering at any time. You also have the right to stop answering at any time until you talk to a lawyer.
- 6.** Now that you understand your rights, are you willing to answer questions without a lawyer present?
