

MORE ABOUT PRONOUNS

Indefinite Pronouns. Some pronouns do not refer to a definite person or thing. The following are called **indefinite pronouns**:

SINGULAR INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

another	anything	either	everything	no one
anybody	one	everyone	neither	someone
anyone	each	everybody	nobody	somebody

PLURAL INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

both	many	few	several
------	------	-----	---------

Demonstrative Pronouns. Words like *this*, *that*, *these*, and *those* are used to point out which one or ones are meant. They always refer to a definite person or thing, but the words they refer to usually come later.

That is my house. (*house* is the word referred to.)

Interrogative Pronouns. The pronouns *who*, *whose*, *whom*, *which*, and *what* are used to ask questions. When used in this way, they are **interrogative pronouns**.
