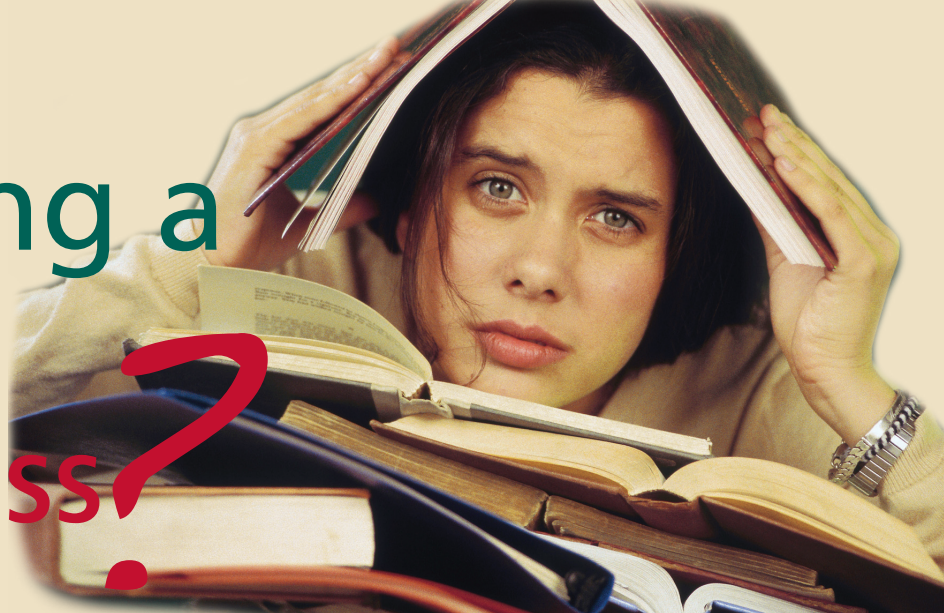


Dropping a Class?



Consider these points before you decide:

- ***If you are on financial aid probation, will you be completing your probation requirements by dropping your class(es)?***
If not, you will be terminated from future federal aid until you complete your termination requirements. Please notify the Financial Aid & Scholarships office when you complete your termination requirements.
- ***Are you currently receiving an institutional scholarship?***
If so, you must receive a 2.0 GPA to continue to receive the scholarship for the following quarter.
- ***Are you dropping a class(es) within the 100% refund period?***
If so, your aid will be adjusted down. For example, if you are currently registered for 12 credit hours and decide to drop down to 9 credit hours, your federal aid will be adjusted down to 3/4 status.
- ***Do you have a student loan on your account?*** If yes, you must be registered for a minimum of 6 credit hours at the time of disbursement to be eligible for the loan. If you drop a class within the 100% refund period and you go below the 6 credit hour requirement, you will no longer be eligible for the student loan. Students with temporary loan funds on their account must also abide by the terms of the temporary funding registration requirements.
- ***If you decide to do a complete withdrawal for the quarter and are receiving federal aid, a "Return of Title IV" calculation must be done.*** This calculation will determine if any funds are owed back to the federal government by the school and student.
