FOR 2012 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES

Sinclair offers a variety of scholarships to new students based on high school academic performance. Sinclair is proud to award a generous amount of scholarships to incoming students each year. These scholarships are available during the school year immediately following high school graduation and range from \$900 - \$2,250 per year.

Presidential Scholarships are offered to students whose credentials are above and beyond the general scholarship requirements. Other criteria considered for these awards include leadership, extracurricular activities and community service. Inside is a description of each scholarship award.

Note: In addition to applying for these specific scholarships, we strongly recommend All students apply for Federal Financial Aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) **by May 1, 2012.**

Students may be eligible to receive federal, state or other institutional aid based on financial need and academic performance.

FOR 2012 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES

Academic Scholarships

The Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship is awarded to academically talented African-American students in the amount of \$500 per semester for two semesters. The special focus of this program is to attract and retain academically talented African-American students in degree granting fields of study at Sinclair. Applicants must have a 2.5 high school grade point average and maintain a 2.5 cumulative grade point average and enroll full-time at Sinclair.

Josiah Colley Scholarship is awarded to new high school graduates in the amount of \$500 per semester for two semesters of study at Sinclair. Applicants must have a high school grade point average of at least 2.5 and enroll as full-time students at Sinclair.

Board of Trustees Award is designed specifically for graduating high school seniors who demonstrate outstanding community or public service that contributes to the betterment of their school, the community or Miami Valley area. The value of the award is \$1,500 for two (2) semesters. Applicants must have a 2.0 cumulative grade point average and be enrolled in a minimum of 6 credit hours. *Must include a letter of recommendation from a professional outlining the service contribution. Award will be prorated based on number of regular hours.*

The Student Leadership Grant is designed for students participating in extracurricular activities or programs that contribute to and promote student leadership skills. Examples of such programs would be student government or other student organizations. The value of the award is \$1,500 per year for two (2) semesters. Applicant *must include a letter of recommendation* from the sponsor of the activity. Applicant must have a 2.0 high school grade point average and maintain a 2.0 cumulative grade point average. Applicants must also be enrolled in a minimum of 6 credit hours at Sinclair. Award will be pro-rated based on number of registered hours.

Attach a resume of involvement in school activities and organizations, leadership positions held and honors/awards received. Work and volunteer experience should be listed as well. Also include the major in college you plan to pursue.

Please ask your Sinclair admissions counselor or high school guidance counselor for a brochure with an application for these scholarships.

Distinguished Scholarships

Attach a resume of involvement in school activities and organizations, leadership positions held and honors/awards received. Work and volunteer experience should be listed as well.

The Virginia McNeal Trustee

Scholarship is awarded to one student from each high school in Montgomery County, based upon a minimum 2.5 high school grade point average and volunteer service in school and/or the community. The scholarship pays tuition and fees for four semesters during two consecutive years, provided the student is enrolled full time and maintains a 2.5 cumulative grade point average.

The Presidential Scholarship is designed to attract ten elite Montgomery County high school scholars and leaders to Sinclair for full-time study. The Presidential Scholarship targets students with a 3.0 minimum high school grade point average and have demonstrated volunteer service in their school and/or community. The scholarship pays tuition, fees and books up to \$2,250 per year. The scholarship may be renewed for four semesters during two consecutive years as long as he/she maintains a 3.0 GPA.

Students nominated for Presidential and McNeal Memorial Trustee Scholarships must also complete a personal visit with an admission counselor prior to the priority consideration date of March 1, 2012.

**Students must be nominated by a school official, complete an admissions application, along with a letter of recommendation by the March 1 deadline to be fully considered for the scholarships.*

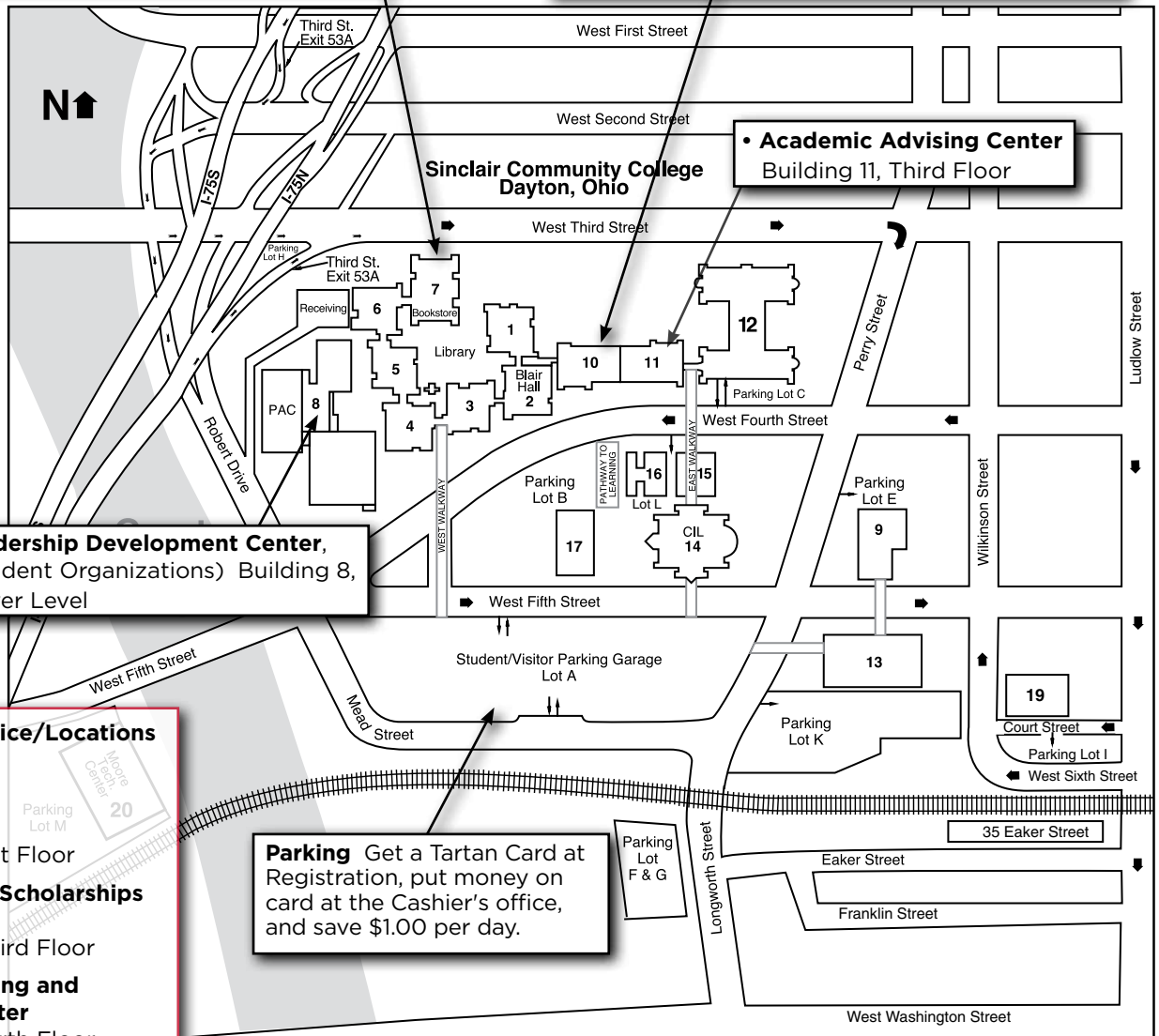
