**A Proud Heritage**

Our mission is to enhance the professionalism and sense of cohesiveness among military intelligence professionals and associated industry partners, and to increase public understanding of the value of military intelligence.

We support conferences, symposia, meetings, and other exchanges of information among members; provide publications and electronic communications to inform members on issues of mutual interest; and support public recognition of military intelligence professionals and organizations through awards programs.

The National Military Intelligence Association (NMIA) was established in 1974, as an Army professional association. It evolved quickly into an organization to provide a professional forum for intelligence professionals in all the military Services, intelligence agencies, offices of the United States Government, Congress, industry, and academia to share ideas for their individual professional enhancement and the good of the Intelligence Community.

NMIA has been, for many years, the sole joint military intelligence professional association for the US armed forces and the various intelligence agencies. Professional development and collaboration among those involved in and supporting military intelligence is vital, because the intelligence function is a basic element of all military operations: on land, at sea, in the air, and in space. The Joint, combined and interagency orientation of NMIA is increasingly relevant as our nation deals with threats to our homeland.

# **NMIA Ohio Scholarship Application Procedures and Guidelines**

## **Purpose**

The National Military Intelligence Association Ohio Chapter's scholarship program is to provide assistance toward education of students interested in a career and in furthering their professional skills in Intelligence. Funds awarded may be used to pay or defray the cost of tuition, room, board, and/or laboratory fees and will be payable to the student's institution.

## **Grants**

The scholarship(s) awards are Grants with no requirement for repayment. The size and number of grants depends upon funds raised annually by the Ohio Chapter of NMIA. A minimum of one scholarship will be awarded each year. Scholarships for full time students will be greater than scholarships for part time students.

## **Eligibility**

To be eligible for this scholarship grant, the applicant must be an Ohio resident, U.S. citizen, junior, senior, or graduate/professional school student at an accredited college or university. Applicants must not be relatives of NMIA or NMIF board or scholarship committee members. Applicants must provide evidence of satisfactory scholastic advancement.

## **Selection**

Selection of grant recipients will be made by the Scholarship Committee of the National Military Intelligence Association Ohio Chapter. Preference will be given to students attending Ohio colleges and universities. **The decision of the Scholarship Committee is final and is not subject to external review.**

## **Deadline**

**Deadline for 2009 scholarship applications is 30 October, 2009.** Applications postmarked or submitted electronically after this date will not be considered by the Scholarship Committee. Grant recipients will be announced in November, 2009 for the 2009-2010 school year.
