IMPORTANT – LIMITED ENROLLMENT/RESTRICTED COURSES

Health Science (HS) degree programs consist of open enrollment courses (general education and division specific) and program specific courses with limited enrollment. The open enrollment courses may be taken prior to entry into the limited enrollment courses. The limited enrollment courses are offered during the technical portion of the program that includes clinical, practicum, or professional practice experience.

The technical component of most programs have restrictions on the number of students that may start the limited enrollment courses each term (or year), based on space availability and accreditor guidelines, e.g.,. Several programs do not have limited enrollment courses- check with department chair and/or Academic Advising.

A student must complete prerequisites and other requirements, including minimum cumulative GPA, to qualify for entry into a program's limited enrollment courses. The process used to select its students for entry is described in the Program Specific Information Packet for each department.

Please meet with Academic Advising for specific information regarding program enrollment or possible waiting lists for entry into the limited enrollment courses.

CERTIFICATE, ASSOCIATE, AND BACHELOR DEGREE PROGRAM ADMISSION PROCESSES

The pre-licensure degree programs within Health Sciences have varying admission processes - Students should refer to the program specific information regarding admissions and meet with a Health Sciences Academic Advisor. In general, however, the Health Sciences division has options for admission that may include:

- General/open admission,
- Competitive admission,
- Accelerated Admission for Academic Achievement (AAAA),
- Tech Prep, or
- Sinclair Health Sciences Academy.

Students are highly encouraged to meet with a Health Sciences Advisor to review all applicable admissions pathways for their selected program and to develop their academic plan (MAP).

GENERAL/OPEN ADMISSION

For programs that use a general/open admission process, students that successfully complete the requirements to qualify for the limited enrollment courses will be offered enrollment into the technical portion of the program on a space available basis. Programs with capacity restrictions may use an eligibility waiting list for a period of time; this varies by HS program.

ACCELERATED ADMISSION FOR ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT (AAAA)

The Division of Health Sciences has established the Accelerated Admission for Academic Achievement (AAAA) admission track for several of its departments). The AAAA program was developed to encourage students to be highly successful in general education/division specific courses taken prior to entry into the limited enrollment courses. Students demonstrating academic excellence are rewarded by accelerated entrance into Health Sciences limited enrollment courses. Participating programs can admit up to 50% of entering students each semester based on academic achievement rather than placement on any waiting lists. IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

- ✓ Health Sciences students may be required to meet health requirements to meet conditions of participating at clinical sites, including immunizations and vaccinations, as well as federal, state, or local government laws and regulations.
- ✓ Health Sciences students who are not U.S. citizens could face barriers to completing the clinical portion of their program of study depending on their immigration status or if they do not have a social security number.
- ✓ Graduates of Health Sciences programs who are not U.S. citizens could face barriers to becoming licensed or credentialed in their disciplines depending on their immigration status or if they do not have a social security number.
- ✓ Students under the age of 18 years may not be permitted by the external sites to participate in clinicals/practicums/field experiences; therefore, this could delay a student's progress through the curriculum. Please contact the department chair for the program of interest if you have additional questions.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students enrolled in Health Sciences programs may be required to purchase an electronic device for class, labs or clinical. These devices, such as a laptop or tablet, can enhance the learning and assessment experience. Many departments have converted to electronic textbooks (ebooks) and resources, to provide automatic updates as well as reducing cost to our students.

Any program(s) requiring a device will work with the Bookstore to ensure financial aid may be used.

Step 1 a	<p>If you are a new student, apply to Sinclair Community College at apply.sinclair.edu or visit the Welcome Center, Building 10, 1st floor. Step 1 b	<p>If you are currently enrolled and want to add or change your program of study, meet with a Health Sciences Academic Advisor to update your official record.</p>
Step 1 c	<p>If your program of study offers Accelerated Admission for Academic Achievement (AAAA) and you think you qualify, review the program specific information on the department webpage and contact your Academic Advisor for information on AAAA criteria and selection process.</p>
Step 2	<p>Meet with a Health Sciences Academic Advisor to plan your course enrollment, review program admission criteria, and create your MAP (My Academic Plan) for the program of study of your choice. Step 3	<p>If you have transferable college credit, request your official transcripts from previous colleges/universities to be sent directly to Sinclair Community College, Registration & Student Records, 444 West Third Street, Dayton OH 45402-1460.</p>
Step 4	<p>If you do not have transferable college credit in English Composition and/or mathematics, your placement will need to be determined. Contact the Sinclair Welcome Center by calling 937-512-3000 to find out if your high school transcript and/or ACT/SAT scores can be used for placement or if you will need to take placement testing. Step 5	<p>Review the program curriculum, program specific requirements, and deadlines. Meet with your Health Sciences Academic Advisor. Links to program websites can be found at: http://www.sinclair.edu/academics/divisions/hs/</p> <p><i>Please note: Several programs have time-sensitive rules for select courses. Please see Academic Advising to learn more.</i></p>
Step 6	<p>Review program specific requirements and deadlines on the department's webpage and meet with your Health Sciences Academic Advisor.</p>

Step 7		To enroll in any online course , you must complete a free, self-paced course entitled "How to Succeed in eLearn" prior to registering for the first time in an online course. This course is available 24/7 and takes approximately 30 minutes to complete. There are no grades or credits attached to this course; it simply guides you through a comprehensive tutorial, giving you a chance to find out what it is like to be in a Sinclair online course. Step 8		Complete pre-college level courses , if any, resulting from placement determination. For questions regarding placement or pre-college level classes, please meet with Academic Advising.
Step 9		Meet with a Health Sciences Academic Advisor to verify eligibility and to confirm if the HESI is required for your program of study (select programs do <u>not</u> require the HESI). The purpose of the requirement is to assist in determining students' academic preparedness for the Health Sciences programs. Additionally, test results will assist Academic Advisors in providing students with recommendations for preparing for the academic rigor of the HS programs. https://www.sinclair.edu/academics/divisions/hs/
Step 10		Take the Health Education Systems, Inc. Admission Assessment (HESI A2) if required. Contact your Health Sciences Academic Advisor once complete. <i>HESI information provided on the next page of this document.</i>
Step 11		Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA to qualify for the limited enrollment courses. In addition, HS programs require that all courses in the curriculum be completed with at least a "C" grade. For specific program requirements, please see the Program Specific Information at respective department.
Step 12		Complete the requirements to qualify for the limited enrollment course See the Program Specific Information process for entry into program courses with limited enrollment/restricted courses under the respective department and meet with a Health Sciences Academic Advisor.
Step 13		Complete all courses listed in the program's curriculum with a grade of "C" or better in order to continue in the program and graduate.

Health Education Systems, Inc. Admission Assessment (HESI A2)

Purpose of the HESI exam:

Students applying to several Health Sciences (HS) programs may be required to take the HESI (select programs are exempt from the HESI; see Academic Advising to learn more).

The purpose of the requirement is to assist in determining students' academic preparedness for the HS programs. Additionally, test results will assist academic advisors in providing students with recommendations for preparing for the academic rigor of the HS programs.

Policy & Procedure

Students will not be permitted to begin the program's limited enrollment courses, or be put on the program's eligibility waiting list, until the HESI requirement is completed.
